Scholarshíp

On June 8 and again on June 29, Kathy Cowles and Marilyn Folnsbee held in-person interviews at **CPCC** with candidates for the Mint Hill Scholarship monies.

This year we had \$4,000 in available scholarship monies.

Our 2022-2023 Scholarship recipients include:

\$ 1,400.00 – Namorthe Richemone Program: Medical Lab Tech (GPA 3.13)

Namorthe is originally from Haiti. She came to the United States in November 2002. She is a single mom of a 14–year old daughter and currently is working as a CNA at ACTS. Namorthe will begin her clinicals in August (2 year program). She indicated the scholarship money will help her achieve her goal to become a Medical Laboratory Technician by helping to pay her tuition so she can graduate next year.

\$1,400.00 - Rebecca Feldman Program: Information Technology (GPA 4.0)

Rebecca currently works 30-35 hours at Good Food on Montford while carrying a 17 hour course load at CPCC. After working 10 years in the service industry, she decided to return to school to pursue a AAS in Software Development. She initially began her college studies at North Texas State University but dropped out in 2012. She feels that she is now better prepared to be an exemplary student and achieve her goals. Rebecca indicated the scholarship money will allow her to work fewer hours to focus more on her studies while still providing for her household.

\$1,200.00 – Eric M Program: Information Technology (GPA 3.1)

Eric is a 2021 graduate of Rocky River High School where he played football. He is currently enrolled in the summer program at CPCC completing his core classes. He is enrolled in 12 credit hours in the Fall. His interest is in Cloud Based Virtual Technology. His main goal is to finish his current degree while looking for internships and completing the CompTIA Certification. Eric indicated the scholarship money will help with his tuition costs and help him gather the necessary resources to further his education.

As you can see, we distributed all of our available funds to these **3 very worthy** applicants. We know the funds will give them a good start toward their financial obligations.
